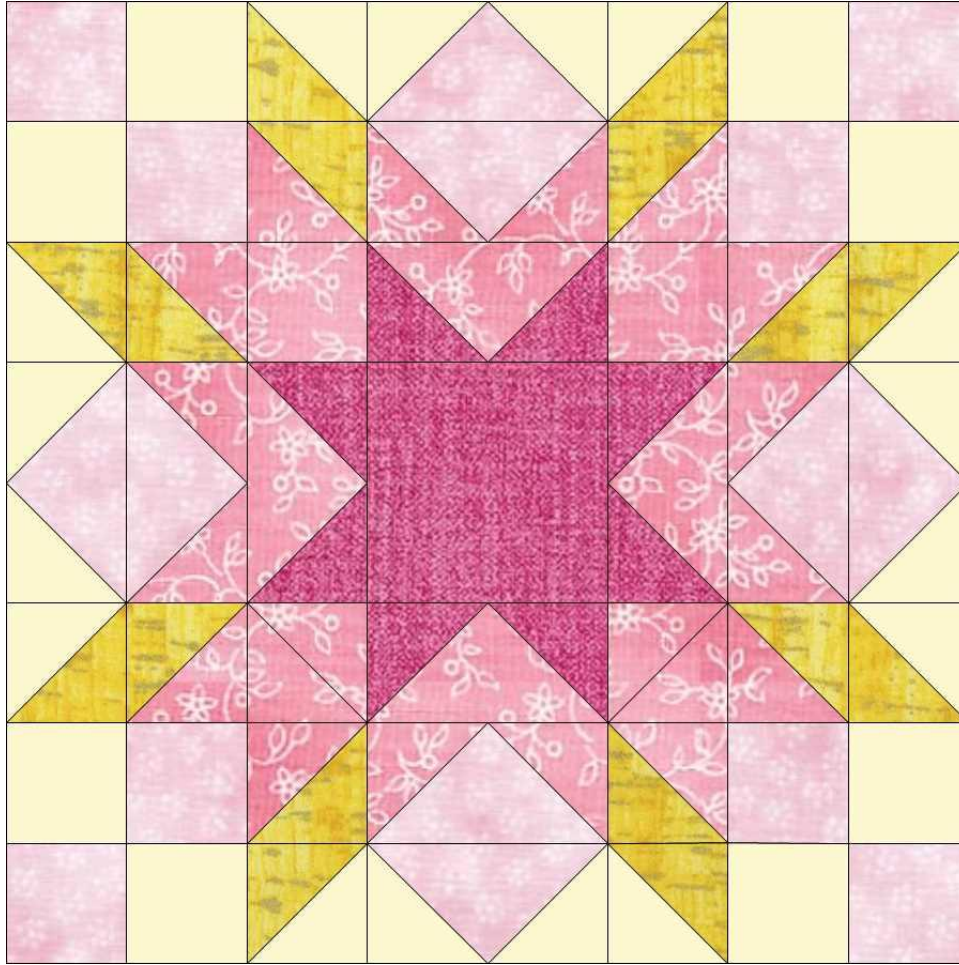


Barn Star Baby Block Quilt



Skill: Confident Beginner*

*The construction is not complicated, but stay organized.

Size: 48" x 48"

Yardage:

2/3 y Yellow

1/2 y Gold

2/3 y Light Pink

2/3 y Medium Pink

1/2 y Raspberry Pink

All seam allowances are 1/4".

Cut:

Yellow

Eight squares 6-1/2" x 6-1/2"

Eight squares 6-7/8" x 6-7/8"

Gold

Eight squares 6-7/8" x 6-7/8"

Light Pink

Eight squares 6-1/2" x 6-1/2"

Two squares 13-1/4" x 13-1/4"

Medium Pink

Four squares 6-1/2" x 6-1/2"

One square 13-1/4" x 13-1/4"

Eight squares 6-7/8" x 6-7/8"

Dark Pink

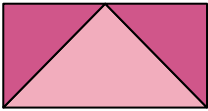
Four squares 6-7/8" x 6-7/8"

One square 12-1/2" x 12-1/2"

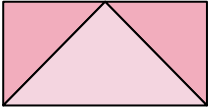
TIP

As you cut squares, pin a note reminder of the size to each shape to stay organized.

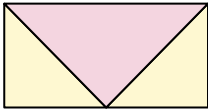
No-Waste Flying Geese Units



Make four flying geese units from dark pink and medium pink.



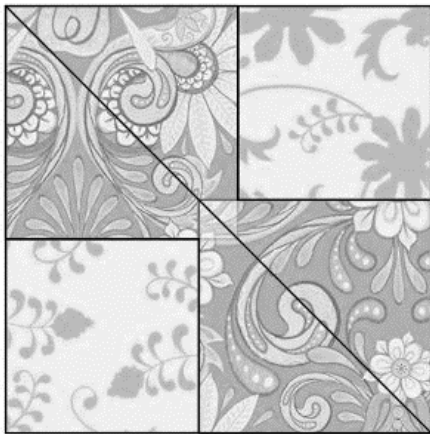
Make four flying geese units from medium pink and light pink.



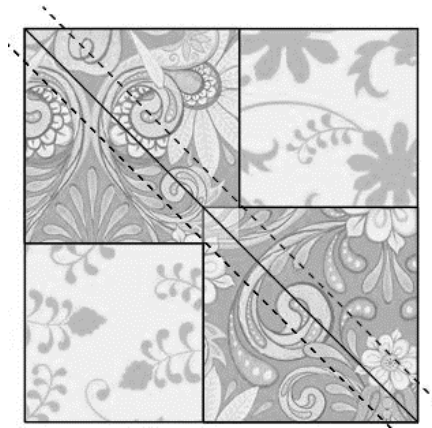
Make four flying geese units from light pink and yellow.

NOTE: Flying geese construction shown in sample fabrics.

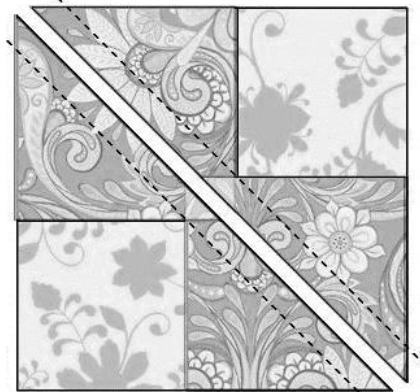
- For each set colorway of flying geese, mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of all four 6-7/8" squares.
- Lay two squares on the 13-1/4" larger square, matching right sides, to create a large diagonal line.
- Pin pieces together, perpendicular to the marked line.



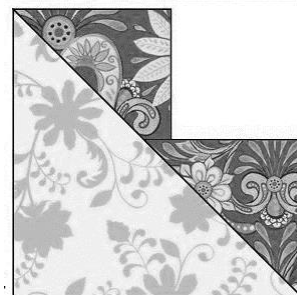
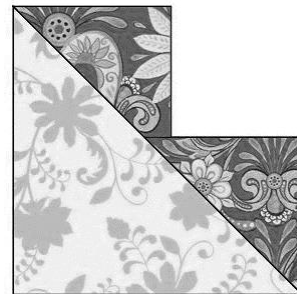
- Sew 1/4" from the marked line on the right and left sides.



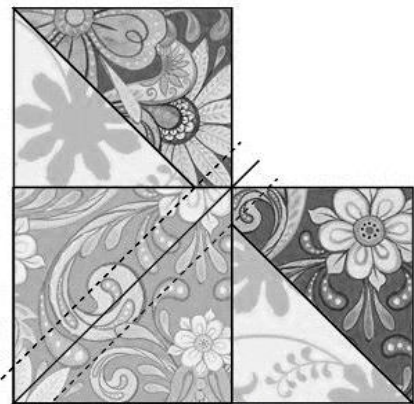
- Cut along the marked line.



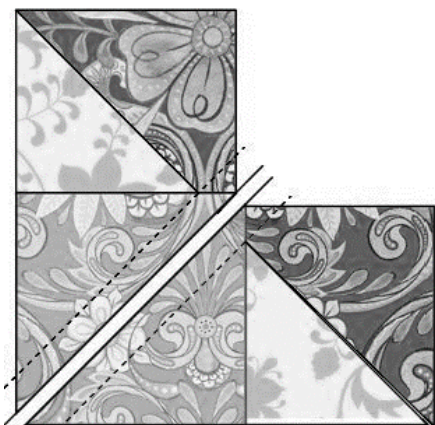
- Open the smaller triangles and press the seam allowances towards the smaller triangles. If you've created two slightly-weird heart shapes, you are on the right track.



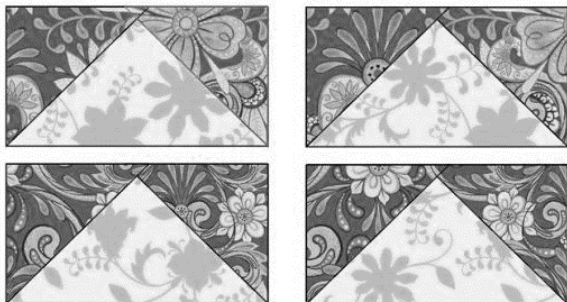
- Lay the remaining 6-7/8" squares on each of the larger triangle pieces; making sure the diagonal line points "deep in the heart." Easy to remember, right?
- Sew 1/4" from the right and left of the marked line.



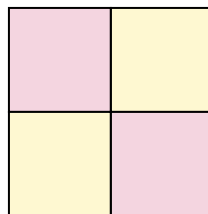
- Cut along the marked line.



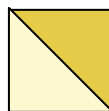
- Open and press seam allowances towards the smaller triangle.
- Each pile of five fabric pieces will yield four large flying geese blocks.



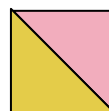
Additional Units



Using the 6-1/2" yellow and light pink squares, create four, 4-patch units.

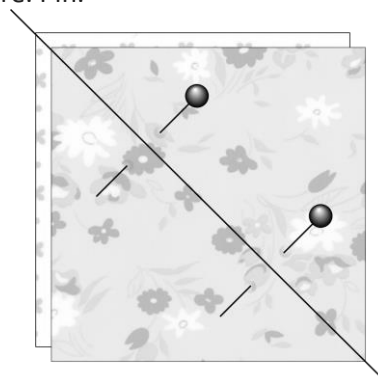


Make eight half-square triangle units from gold and yellow fabrics, 6-7/8" x 6-7/8"

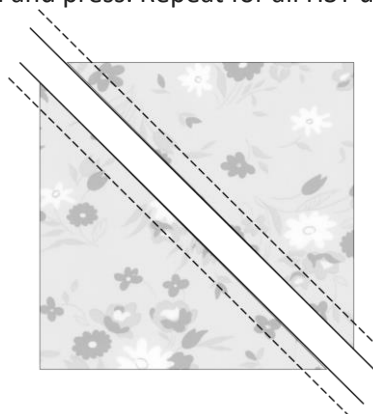


Make eight half-square triangle units from gold and medium pink fabrics, 6-7/8" x 6-7/8"

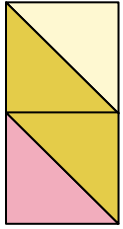
- Layer two 6-7/8" squares, matching right sides. Mark the center diagonal of the top square. Pin.



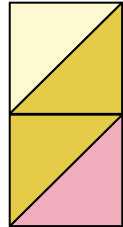
- Sew 1/4" from the marked diagonal line on the right and left sides. Cut along diagonal line. Open and press. Repeat for all HST units.



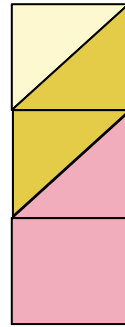
Start Construction



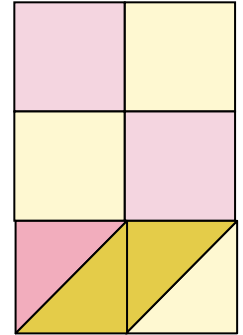
Make four, **each**. Sew HST unit (gold and yellow) to HST unit (gold and medium pink) together.



Notice how the gold creates a diagonal towards the left and towards the right.

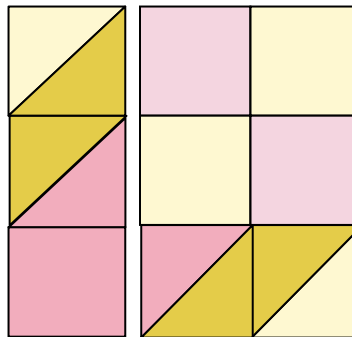
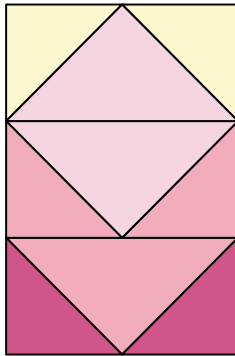


Join the 6-1/2" medium pink square to four of the accent fabric units, as shown.



Join the 4-patch unit to four of the remaining accent fabric units, as shown.

Make four units. Sew flying geese together in groups of three.



Make four identical corner units by joining the two previously created.

Finishing

Finish by aligning seam intersections and sewing the large units in the style of a 9-patch quilt block.
